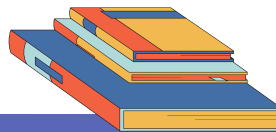


GEOGRAPHY TRIP

Eight Year 12 Fine Art and Graphic Design students visited Manchester Metropolitan University Degree Shows on the 17th June showcasing students work from across Art, Design, Fashion, Digital Arts, Performance and Architecture. Twenty four students from both Years 10 and Year 12 were involved in a 2 day 'Design a Festival' workshop in school facilitated by two creative professionals from Factory International Design team. Thirteen students from both Years 10 and Year 12 took part in a one day work experience programme 'Careers Unlocked' held at Factory International, where they spent the day working alongside creative professionals. Since then students have organised individual work experiences with a Graphic Designer from the programme. Three art workshops were held in the art department for groups of visiting Chinese Students. A group of Year 7 students created a poster in Mandarin to welcome the Chinese students to King David High School, co-ordinated by Raven Chan 7S and Zikra Lal 7Y. Gavriel Mintz has been accepted onto a Summer Young Creative Programme at Home where he will be involved in a variety of workshops exploring Film, Theatre and Visual Arts activities.

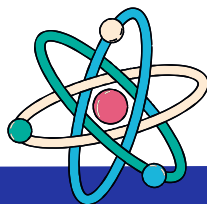

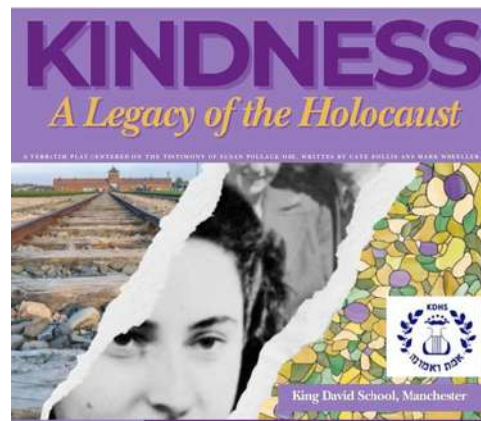
This term has been filled with meaningful, thought-provoking, and spiritually uplifting informal Jewish experiences, all of which have contributed to strengthening our pupils' sense of Jewish identity and connection to Israel.

To mark **Yom HaShoah**, we were honoured to host the exceptional verbatim theatre production **Kindness – A Legacy of the Holocaust**. Based on the testimony of Holocaust survivor **Susan Pollack OBE**, the production brought her powerful story to life through the medium of theatre.

With two performances—one for our pupils and one open to the wider community—this event offered a deeply moving and unforgettable opportunity to reflect on the importance of memory, resilience, and the enduring strength of the Jewish people.

On **Yom HaZikaron**, the school came together to honour the sacrifices of fallen soldiers and victims of terror in Israel. The Ivrit department, led by Mr Sadeh and our shinshinit Noa, delivered a memorable and engaging assembly that captured the emotional weight of the day. Through stories, music, and reflection, pupils connected more deeply to the values of courage, nationhood, and our shared responsibility to uphold the legacy of those who gave their lives for our homeland.

The **Year 7 Bat Mitzvah Programme**, run in partnership with GIFT, offered a wonderful opportunity for personal and spiritual growth. Highlights included a special visit to the GIFT centre for a hands-on **challah bake**, helping the girls connect Jewish tradition with acts of giving. The programme concluded with a celebratory ceremony on July 4th, acknowledging each participant's development and contribution, and reinforcing their sense of pride in their identity and values as young Jewish women.

WHY ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Students with less than 90% attendance (that's just 1 day off every 2 weeks) are far less likely to achieve 5 good GCSEs, including English and Maths.

Over five years of secondary school, missing just one day a fortnight means losing six full months of classroom time.

Young people who leave school with lower qualifications due to absence are likely to earn £100,000–£250,000 less over their working life.

YONDR POUCHES



From September, King David High School will become a phone-free environment with the introduction of Yondr pouches, a system used in thousands of schools across the world to support focused, engaged learning.

Each student will be given a personal Yondr pouch to safely store their phone during the school day, helping to reduce distractions and improve both academic performance and social interaction. Students will keep their phones in their possession, but the pouch remains locked until the end of the day.

The cost of the pouch is £20 via ParentPay and it is now considered part of the school uniform.

Feedback from our community has already been very positive, and we're excited to see all students using the system in September.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Your child may be entitled to free school meals and additional pupil premium funding if you get one of the following:

- Universal Credit—and your earned income is less the £7400 a year, after tax and not including any benefits
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, providing you do not get Working Tax Credit, and your annual gross income is less that £16,190
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- If you get Working Tax Credit you will not be eligible unless you are receiving the four week 'run on ' payment after stopping work.

Free school meals are also available for eligible households with:

- Children at local authority maintained nurseries, if they receive education before and after lunch
- Students who receive Income Support or Income-based Jobseekers Allowance in their own right.

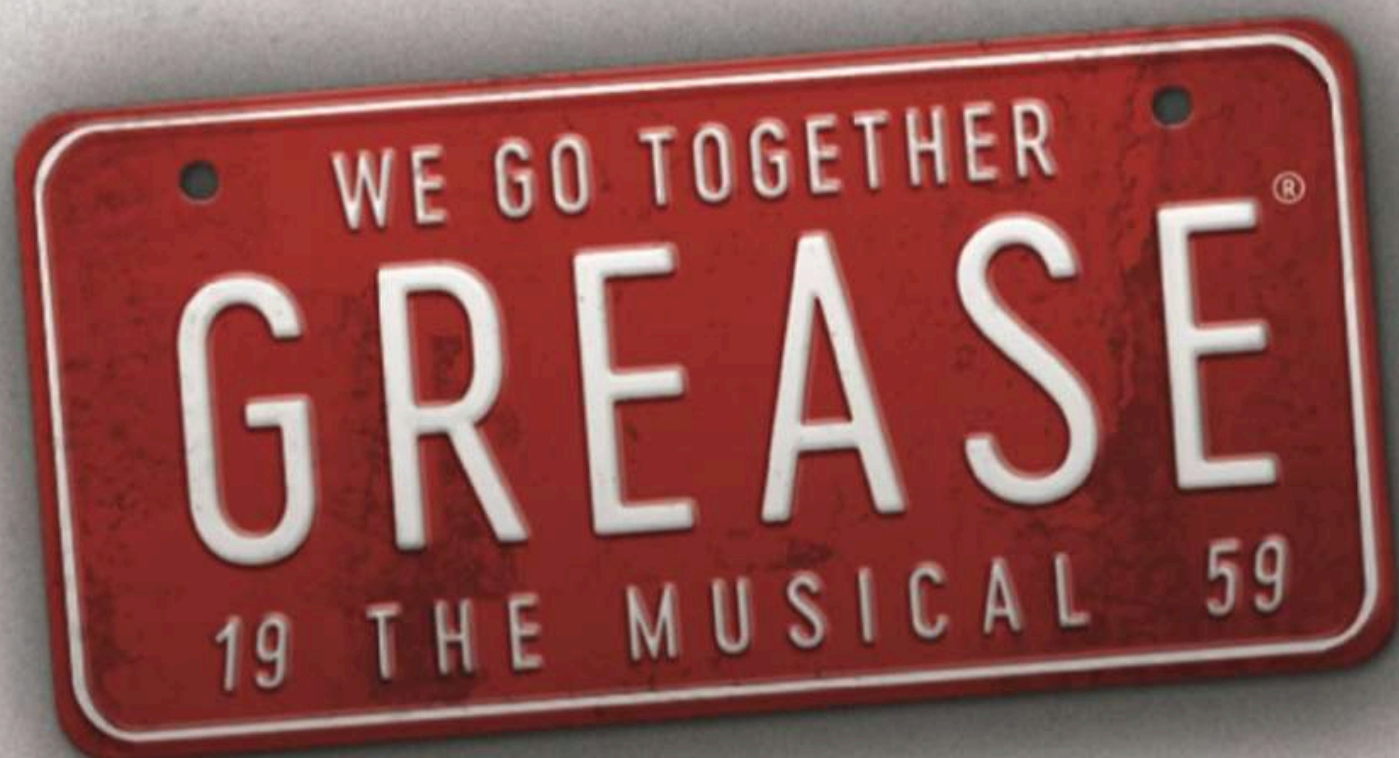
